Graduation Remarks from President Gordon Oliver

Good evening!

Congratulations Class of 2011.

On behalf of our Office of Advancement and Alumni Relations I welcome you to the Saint John's Alumni Association.

Before I continue, I would like to thank Saint Katharine Drexel Church and Father Keith Boisvert as well as St. John Regional Catholic School and Principal Karen Smith for all their support and for sharing their facilities with us this evening.

I want to recognize the members of our Board of Trustees who are with us this evening for this special celebration.

And also acknowledge our faculty whose unwavering commitment to our students and to Catholic education is unsurpassed.

to Christ" booklet contains readings for each day of the year. Sometimes the daily reading is a story with a moral or ethical message or theme. It could also be a prayer or even be a spiritual poem or a recitation from sacred scripture. The short vignette that I would like to share this evening was written by Father Mark Link of the Society of Jesus, which I thought appropriate because our school's founder Father John McElroy was a Jesuit.

Father Link recounts the story about a basketball coach who had the gift of inspiring teams with the courage to fight back when things looked impossible and at their bleakest.

During halftime of one particular game, the coach stood before the team in the locker room and bellowed, "Did Michael Jordan ever quit?"

The team yelled back, "No!"

The coach yelled, "Did Cal Ripken Jr. ever quit?"

"No!" the team yelled.

"What about the Wright brothers, did they ever quit?"

"No!" the team shouted.

Then the coach said, "What about Elmer McAllister, did he ever quit?"

There was an awkward pause with the team members looking quizzically at one another. Then the team captain said, "Coach, we never heard of him."

"Of course you haven't," shouted the coach, "He quit!"

The theme of persevering in the face of adversity or disappointment or when things seem down and at a low point is a familiar one and certainly one that all of us have had to contend with at one time or another.

In World War II, as the enemy was mustering its armies across the English Channel in French towns such as Calais for the

invasion of England, and the Battle of Britain was raging in the skies over the British Isles, Winston Churchill implored the people of Britain to, "Never, never, never, never give up." In those perilous days of the blitz of World War II, my grandfather had been an air raid warden in London. He was responsible for getting people into bomb shelters. Then after the all clear was given, he would pull survivors from the rubble. My mother would often speak of having to take cover under the solid oak table in the dining room with my two older siblings as the bombs dropped on London where as a young mother she lived. Heeding Churchill's words, the British never did give up.

Emigrating from England in 1966 when I still had traces of an English accent and as I began to falter on the third lap of competition in the mile, my track coach in high school would motivate me by saying, "When the going gets tough, the English get going."

Years ago, I had the opportunity to work as an educational administrator and coach for a marvelous independent private school -- the Hill School in Middleburg, Virginia. My oldest son, Michael, graduated from Hill. I didn't know the Reverend Richard Peard Rector at Trinity Church in Upperville, Virginia personally, nor had I ever met him. But his legacy endures. He had been a teacher, counselor, and spiritual leader to Hill School's students, teachers, and families. His closing words of inspiration that he delivered to one of the school's graduating classes can be found inscribed in the commons area of the Reverend Richard Peard Music and Lunchroom Building named in his memory.

The inscription reads: "When you have found your way in this world, help someone else find theirs."

I like that!

And so I say to the class of 2011: "When you have found your way in this world, help someone else find theirs."

Good night. Good luck and God bless each and every one of you!



From the Principal, Christopher Cosentino

It is with great pleasure that I write to all of you. As of this writing we are just a few weeks away from starting the 2011-2012 school year. Only a few short months ago we said goodbye to the Class of 2011 at our Baccalaureate Mass and Commencement Exercises. Our graduating class of 50 talented young women and men are going off to prestigious colleges and universities across the country and were awarded over \$4.3 million in scholarships and grants. In addition, our students continued to excel in the Advanced Placement tests offered by The College Board. Seventy-four of our students took 131 AP exams (which is an increase from 105 last year) and 72% of the scores students received were a "3" or higher (out of a maximum of "5", allowing the potential for college credit). Also, there were 28 scores of a perfect "5" on multiple tests.

Looking to the new school year we are excited to welcome a large class of incoming freshmen, including one of the largest classes of siblings. We are so pleased that our families continue to partner with us in the education of their children. We anticipate starting the year with our Mass of the Holy Spirit where we will induct our newest members of our Student Government Association and also have the opportunity for the entire school community to sign our Code of Conduct, where we all pledge to live our school's mission every day.

New this year, we will extend our Spirit Week festivities to include a weekend of Homecoming events. Together with the induction of the Class of 2011 Athletic Hall of Fame Inductees, as well as home sporting events, our alumni, families, and friends will have the opportunity to visit and cheer on our student-athletes.

This school year promises to be exciting and I look forward to all of us making fond memories.

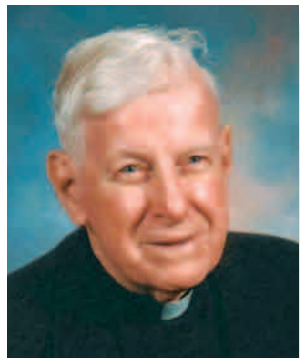

Remembering Two Wonderful Friends



On Monday, May 9, Fr. George B. Reid quietly passed away at St. Catherine's Nursing Home in Emmitsburg, Maryland. He was 91 years old.

Fr. Reid retired in 2006 after serving as Chaplain at SJCP for over 20 years. In the words of Paul McNickle, Marge Pieklo, and Sandy Splaine who worked with him that entire time, "He was a great friend of the school."

As the pastor of St. Mary's Church in Barnesville, Father was a busy priest in his own community. When approached by some of his parishioners who had children attending St. John's at Prospect Hall, Father

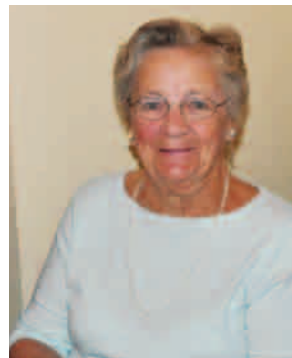
Reid offered his services and began teaching Theology to our young men and women. In addition, he celebrated Mass every day in the chapel he had built in the Mansion and for the entire student body in the gymnasium for all occasions as needed. He met periodically counseling every student and offered the use of his home parish facilities reducing the costs of retreats, Proms, dances, etc. Fr. Reid quietly provided for many of the school's needs out of his own resources. From priestly vestments, altar furnishings, the altar itself (fashioned by a master carpenter), to outdoor statues, and financial aid for needy students, Fr. Reid took care of things that came to his attention, always without fanfare or notice.

His advice was sought and heeded by many of the faculty and staff over the years as well. He presided over marriages, baptisms, and funerals alike, all for those he loved and cared for here at Saint John's. He was a part of everything we did as a school community from liturgies to playing softball, breaking his arm in the process. He loved the students and families of Saint John's.

Father Reid will be honored at the new SJCP school campus. The Administrative Wing on the First Floor will be named the Fr. George B. Reid Hall. This name in honor of Father Reid will be etched onto the outside of the building by the main entrance of the new school and a bronze bust of Fr. Reid will be placed in a prominent place. In addition, several beloved friends of Father Reid have contributed \$18,000 of the \$50,000 needed for The Fr. George B. Reid Humanities Learning Center. Mrs. Marian Shriver McSherry died at her home in Frederick, Maryland on July 24, 2011. Mrs. McSherry was born to Clinton K. and Marian Carbery Macsherry in Baltimore on February 21, 1926. She attended Noroton School of the Sacred Heart in Noroton, CT and Manhattanville College in New York. Mrs. McSherry met Lt. James McSherry, USN in 1945 and were married in 1946.

Mr. and Mrs. James McSherry moved to Frederick in 1948, where they raised their 12 children and remained for the rest of their 59 years of marriage.

They were very involved in the parish of St. John the Evangelist and in the Frederick community. Marian was an active member of the Sodality at St. John's, the Catholic Daughters, the Catholic Evidence League, Birthright, and the St. John's Cemetery Committee. Mrs. McSherry was honored by Pope John Paul II in the bestowal of Pro Ecclesia in 1996 and she and Jim were the recipients of the 1982 Cornerstone Award for Catholic Education. In 1960, she was named the Catholic Mother of the Year. She is remembered as a woman of great faith.

Mr. and Mrs. James McSherry were very supportive of the Saint John's School Community where several of their children attended when it was known as St. John's at Prospect Hall. In the mid 1950's, when the school was run by the parish, they donated the funds to purchase the gymnasium. During a financial difficult time for the school, Mr. and Mrs. McSherry were part of a small group of special friends who were responsible for borrowing money to help make payroll.

Amy Keating, a SJCP Board Member, has known Mrs. McSherry for 20 years and said, "She was an outstanding role model, as a mother, as a woman, and as a Catholic. She is a great loss to the community. We considered her and her family as pillars in the church."

Bernie Grove, an honorary board member, past parent and longtime supporter of Saint John's, has known Mrs. McSherry for over 40 years and said, "Next to my past and present wife, Marian was the finest lady I have ever known."

Mrs. McSherry was honored and recognized at the 28th Annual Soiree in 2009 and again at the 30th Annual Soiree this past spring for her many years of support and generosity. She also played in the Saint John's Classic Golf Tournament this past April.

Mrs. McSherry and her husband made a major gift to The Legacy Campaign to help build the new school. The foyer on the first floor administrative area will be named The McSherry Family. Saint John's is extremely grateful that the McSherry family will continue to bless our school community with their generosity today and for many years to come.

Tara Giangrande Receives Award

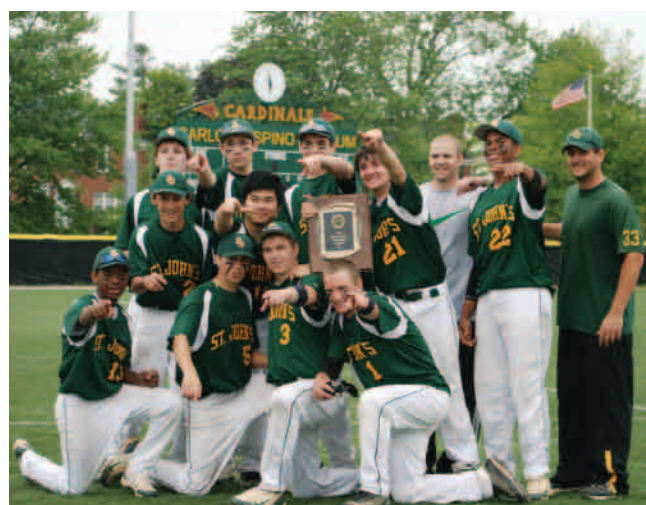

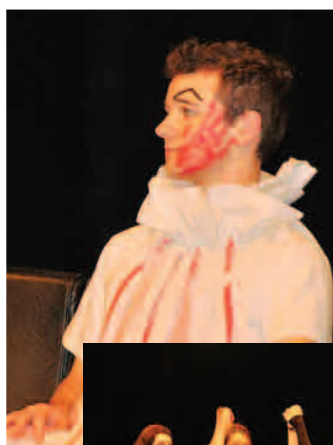
Mock Trial Finishes with a Great Season!

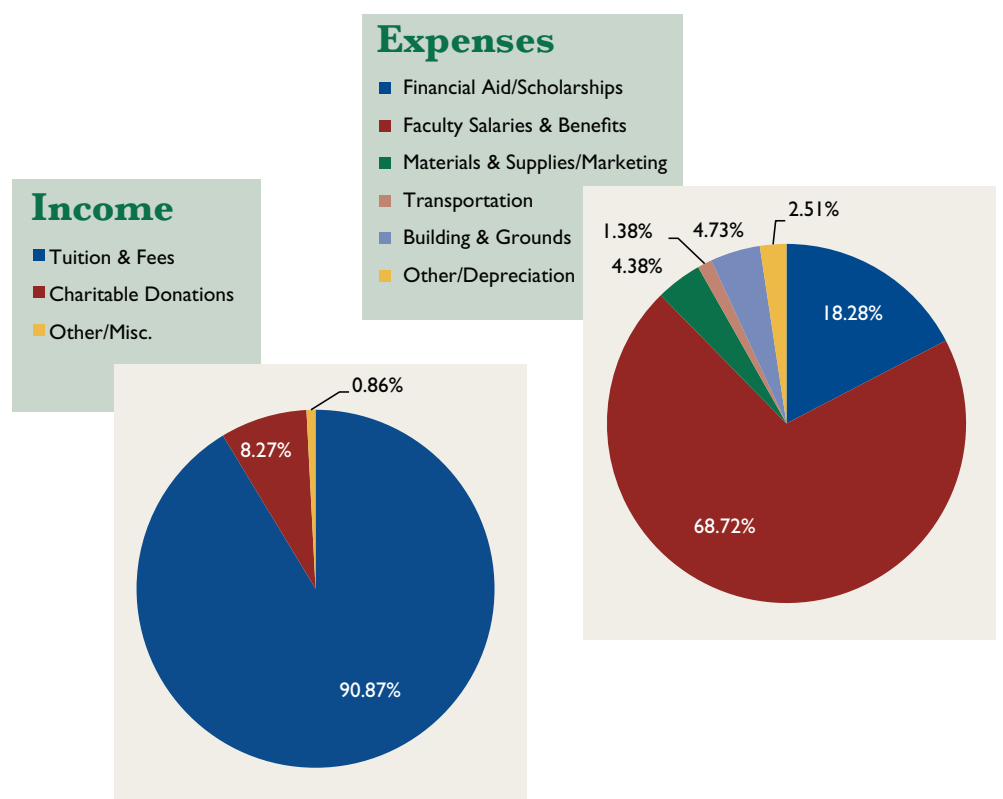
