AP ART STUDIO 2018–19

Summer Assignments

AP Studio Art is a college level course promoting a sustained investigation of all three aspects of an AP Studio Art Portfolio: quality, concentration and breath – as outlined at https://apstudent.collegeboard.org/apcourse/ap-studio-art-2-d-design. This course will teach you a variety of concepts and approaches to drawing, two-dimensional design and use of Art Media.

This course will allow you to develop mastery in concept, composition, drawing, and the execution of design in a two-dimensional format. For your concentration portfolio, you will be able to select a personal theme that allows you to investigate a topic in depth, to demonstrate a range of abilities, and to further explore art media. In selecting a personal theme you will also be able to explore art-making as an ongoing process that involves problem-solving and critical decision-making as well as artistic growth. In addition, you will be able to experiment with the use of one medium in depth, or the use of several media.

At the beginning of May, 2019 you will need to submit a portfolio of (24) total works to the College Board, consisting of: **QUALTIY**: Five original artworks (these may be taken from the other 2 portfolio sections, **CONCENTRATION**: 12 slides of your thematic choice, and **BREADTH**: 12 slides demonstrating a range of projects done in various media.

During the school year you will have 36 weeks (2 semesters @ 18 weeks each) to complete 24 or more quality artworks. You may use quality work from past classes, but assuming that all work will be done during the school year, you will need to complete approximately one quality, college-level artwork each week. As you might imagine, this can be a challenging and strenuous journey when combined with your other commitments during the school year... so summer break is the perfect time to sharpen your drawing skills and to work on quality pieces for your portfolio!

AP Art Studio Summer Assignments (5):

All assignments are due on the first full day of class. These works will count as your first grades of the semester. Assignments are 80% of your final grade so this is a great chance to start the year off strong! Each item listed will count as one fully graded assignment.

1. Start a sketchbook to start recording in throughout the summer. Use this book as a source for inspiration. You can draw, write, glue pictures in... If you are not sure what to put in your sketchbook, choose from the following list for subjects and journal activities. Visit a gallery or show and write about what you saw, include photos or sketches of the 3 pieces that affected you most. YOU MUST FILL 25 FULL PAGES IN YOUR SKETCHBOOK - 50 pts

- Sketchbook entries SHOULD NOT include:
 - 1. Copies of other artists' work or published photographs, unless dramatically altered for creative purposes. Remember, this constitutes plagiarism!
 - 2. Cutsie, precious, trite images; as a college level class, students are expected to challenge themselves creatively.
 - 3. A lot of artwork representing things the student already draws well: while students may include some such drawing in their sketchbooks, it is expected that AP Art students will challenge themselves to draw things that they haven't already mastered.
- 2. Fill 4 pages with an assortment of sketches of BOTH HANDS and FEET 50 pts
- 3. Create a board on Pinterest titled "AP Studio..." Photograph things that may be helpful when you're looking for ideas to draw and search the web for ideas that you may use for inspiration and add them to your Pinterest folder. You should have at least 20 images added to your folder by the end of summer. They can be inspiration for the subject of an artwork, the style, technique anything that you think may help you create! 25 pts
- 4. Create 2 FINISHED pieces of art for your Breadth Portfolio. Choose from one of the following:

reflections on events
entries representing feelings and emotions
first-hand observation of people, landscapes, still-life
contour drawings
collage
self portraits
landscape
still life
portraiture

FOR FINAL ACCEPTANCE TO THE CLASS, EACH PIECE MUST SCORE A 68 OR HIGHER ON THE RUBRIC (SEE ATTACHED).
